Master of Advanced Studies in Humanitarian Action

Blended Learning **Option I:** 14 months **Option II:** Two-Three year flexible entry

This Executive Master programme is a unique **blended learning** postgraduate course on humanitarian action providing current and future humanitarian professionals with the managerial, theoretical and practical skills needed to optimize responses to humanitarian crises.

Our programme has been developed in response to the growing need to understand, question and reform today's humanitarian system, and it is delivered in collaboration with our partner organisations, the **International Committee of the Red Cross (ICRC) and Médecins Sans Frontières (MSF)**. The programme offers evidence-based, cross-disciplinary and cross-cultural education in the field of humanitarian action.

The Master of Advanced Studies in Humanitarian Action is a flexible and modular course, allowing students to choose from two options to organize their studies: either a 14-month consecutive course, or a flexible 2-3 year course.

MAS Option I: 14-month consecutive course

The next MAS starts in September 2021 with a "core course", residential term. It continues with a second, online term, focusing on the quality management of humanitarian projects. The third term is composed of five elective short online courses and it is followed by the last term: a dissertation.

- **Term One:** September - December 2021 - residential term in Geneva
- **Term Two:** January - April 2022 - online
- **Term Three:** April - October 2022 - online
- **Term Four:** Final dissertation by 31 October 2022 - online

MAS Option Two: Flexible programme (up to 38 months)

This option gives participants the flexibility to start the MAS with the core course (term one), or with any other courses that are part of the MAS programme. Students have up to 38 months to complete the 60 ECT credits necessary for the MAS.

Diploma of Advanced Studies in Humanitarian Action

This Diploma offers professionals a critical understanding of the humanitarian system analysing past, present and future responses, therefore giving participants the ability to contextualize humanitarian action in today's world and apply this to their work.

Objectives

At the end of the course, participants will have developed a critical understanding of contemporary humanitarian action informed by academic scholarship, which will enable them to become better informed, and more aware and effective humanitarian practitioners, more autonomous in their decisions.

The course is divided in five modules:

M1: Humanitarianisms

M2: Contexts, Actions and Consequences

M3: Revisiting Vulnerability and Needs

M4: Humanitarian Governance, Norms and Principles

M5: The Humanitarians

The Diploma also includes the writing of a final dissertation.

Certificate of Advanced Studies: Quality Management of Humanitarian Projects

This certificate addresses the dynamics and components that guarantee the quality management of adapted projects and cohesive teams. It integrates fundamental principles such as inclusion and diversity, do no harm, accountability and participation into processes, methods and tools of project and people management. The course benefits from guest lecturers from various partner organisations including MSF, SPHERE, HQAI, CHS Alliance and Terre des Hommes.

Executive Short Courses - 2 ECTS

SEXUAL VIOLENCE IN CONFLICT SETTINGS AND EMERGENCIES

The overall objective of the course is to provide mid-level and senior managers the knowledge and skills required to conceive a multidisciplinary approach to respond to the complex needs of survivors of sexual violence in conflicts and emergencies. The course is delivered in partnership with the **International Committee of the Red Cross (ICRC), Médecins sans Frontières (MSF), Refugee Law Project, UNHCR, and independent human rights experts.**

Duration: Eight weeks
Dates: 17 March – 5 May 2021
Format: Online
Tuition fee: CHF 1,500

HUMANITARIAN PROJECT CYCLE MANAGEMENT

This executive course aims at strengthening the capacities of project managers to design humanitarian responses that focus on sustainable and locally defined changes. The course is based on the Results-Based Management (RBM) approach and provides concepts and tools for each phase of the project cycle.

Duration: 3-5 weeks
Dates: 22 March – 23 April, 2021 (Full version)
22 March - 9 April, 2021 (Short version)
Format: Online
Tuition fee: CHF 1,500

PARTICIPATORY APPROACHES WITH CRISIS-AFFECTED COMMUNITIES

This course focuses on the development of a comprehensive knowledge and understanding of the challenges, opportunities and limits of dialogue with communities – including intercultural communication, accountability and strategy – to build constructive relationships. Based on the experience and know-how of various organisations, the course is a mix of theory and practical exercises.

Duration: One week

DESIGNING AN ADVOCACY STRATEGY FOR HUMANITARIAN ACTION

Using lectures, case studies and discussions with professionals in humanitarian advocacy, develop strategic skills to better analyse specific contexts, map stakeholders, and design effective advocacy strategies in support of operational humanitarian projects.

MEDIA AND HUMANITARIAN ACTION

This executive short course provides a comprehensive understanding of traditional and digital media. It focuses specifically on the uses of media in humanitarian settings and with humanitarian organisations. Students will be able to critically reflect on the influence and power of the media and learn how to fully use their potential for effective communication.

PLANETARY HEALTH

This executive course is a full time training, given by climate experts and humanitarian health practitioners, which focuses on the climate emergency and its impacts on health.

NEGOTIATION IN HUMANITARIAN CRISES

This online training, delivered in partnership with the **Centre of Competence on Humanitarian Negotiation (CCHN)**, focuses on the design of adapted negotiation strategies in humanitarian settings, as well as the development of participant's self-awareness. It links real situations experienced by participants with the latest concepts around humanitarian negotiation, meaning negotiations aimed at securing access, assistance and protection for civilians facing humanitarian emergencies.

Duration: One week

NON-COMMUNICABLE DISEASES IN HUMANITARIAN SETTINGS

This executive short course focuses on the particular challenges presented by non-communicable diseases in emergencies, as well as the design of adapted and effective projects to address non-communicable diseases. The course is delivered in partnership with the **Centre for Global Chronic Conditions at the London School of Hygiene & Tropical Medicine.**

Duration: One week

CASH AND VOUCHER ASSISTANCE IN HUMANITARIAN CRISES: WHAT WORKS?

This executive short course has a dual objective to build students' practical skills to design, implement and monitor projects using Cash and Voucher Assistance (CVA) as well as build their critical and reflexive skills on the topic of cash and voucher assistance.

Duration: One week

PROTECTION IN HUMANITARIAN SETTINGS

This executive short course aims at analyzing the activities undertaken by humanitarian actors and the international community to protect the fundamental rights of specific categories of vulnerable communities, in accordance with human rights law, international humanitarian law and refugee law.

SEXUAL AND REPRODUCTIVE HEALTH IN HUMANITARIAN CRISES

This executive course is a full time training, given by academic staff and humanitarian practitioners, which focuses on Sexual and Reproductive Health (SRH) in humanitarian crises, using specific methods and tools. This course is delivered in partnership with the **UN Population Fund (UNFPA)** and the **London School of Hygiene and Tropical Medicine**.

Duration: One week

HEALTH SYSTEM ASSESSMENT IN HUMANITARIAN CRISES

The primary purpose of this intensive executive short course, based on the book published by Professor Blanchet 'Applied Systems Thinking for Health Systems Research' is to familiarize participants with a health systems approach to healthcare for communities in low and middle countries affected by humanitarian crises.

HUMANE LEADERSHIP AND PEOPLE MANAGEMENT

While critically reviewing the current trends and practices around leadership and people management, this executive short course aims at giving you the opportunity to ascertain the leader you are and situate your style within your preferred conceptual and practical framework.

Massive Online Open Course

HUMANITARIAN COMMUNICATION: ADDRESSING KEY CHALLENGES

The Massive Online Open Course (MOOC) "Humanitarian communication, addressing key challenges" allows participants to gain some of the competencies by focusing on the main challenges of communications in humanitarian settings and the means to address these challenges. The five-week online FREE course requires three to four hours of work per week and offers maximum flexibility to remotely-connected participants, who learn at their own pace.

Duration: Five weeks; 3-4 hours of work per week
Offered several times throughout the academic year

Format: Online

Tuition fee: Free

Audience

- Professionals in the humanitarian, development or social sector looking to develop their competencies as well as reflect and capitalise on their experiences
- Professionals from other sectors who wish to increase their understanding of the humanitarian sector for a potential career change
- Graduate students with relevant volunteer or intern experience, looking to undertake a post-graduate course with a view to entering the humanitarian sector.

Scholarships

Students who come from and work in countries designated as "least developed", "lower income" and "lower middle income" are eligible for scholarships in the **DAC list of ODA Recipients**. **Candidates can apply for a scholarship by filling in the online application form.**

Language

All our courses are run in English (except where indicated). Students need to prove their level of competence when applying.
