## Planetary Health

10-14 May 2021

Course fee: 1,500 CHF

This executive course is an intensive training, given by climate experts and humanitarian health practitioners, which focuses on the climate emergency and its impacts on health.

## Sexual and Reproductive Health in Humanitarian Crises

14-18 June 2021

Course fee: 1,500 CHF

This executive course is an intensive training, given by academic staff and humanitarian practitioners, which focuses on Sexual and Reproductive Health (SRH) in humanitarian crises, reviewing the latest evidence and using specific methods and tools. This course is delivered in partnership with the **UN Population Fund (UNFPA)** and the Health in Humanitarian Crises at the **London School of Hygiene and Tropical Medicine**.

## Non Communicable Diseases in Humanitarian Settings

25-28 May 2021

Registration Deadline: 10 May 2021

Course fee: 1,500 CHF

This executive short course focuses on the particular challenges presented by non-communicable diseases in emergencies, as well as the design of adapted and effective projects to address non-communicable diseases. The course is delivered in partnership with the **Centre for Global Chronic Conditions at the London School of Hygiene & Tropical Medicine**, with contributions from **MSF** and **ICRC** professionals.

## Health System Assessment in Humanitarian Crises

21-25 June 2021

Registration Deadline: 7 June 2021

Course fee: 1,500 CHF

The primary purpose of this intensive executive short course, based on the book published by Professor Blanchet 'Applied Systems Thinking for Health Systems Research' is to familiarize participants with a health systems approach to healthcare for communities in low and middle countries affected by humanitarian crises.
